YEOVIL was full of the cup-tie spirit to-day. Almost every vehicle displayed the green and white emblem or sprig of white heather. Even the Town Council salvage cart proudly displayed yards of green and white streamers.

Earliest arrivals at the Huish ground were some 30 Bury supporters who had travelled through the night by coach. After having a look at the ground at day-break they went off for breakfast.

Nearly all the business houses in the town are closing down for a couple of hours this afternoon and the few shops that remain open will be kept going by a skeleton staff.

To-day's was a thoroughly mixed draw in which eight of the 32 ties concerned clubs of similar status. Several games in which for varied reasons rivalry could be expected to be more than usually intense, and the memory of the corresponding round last season which provided a glut of shock results.
