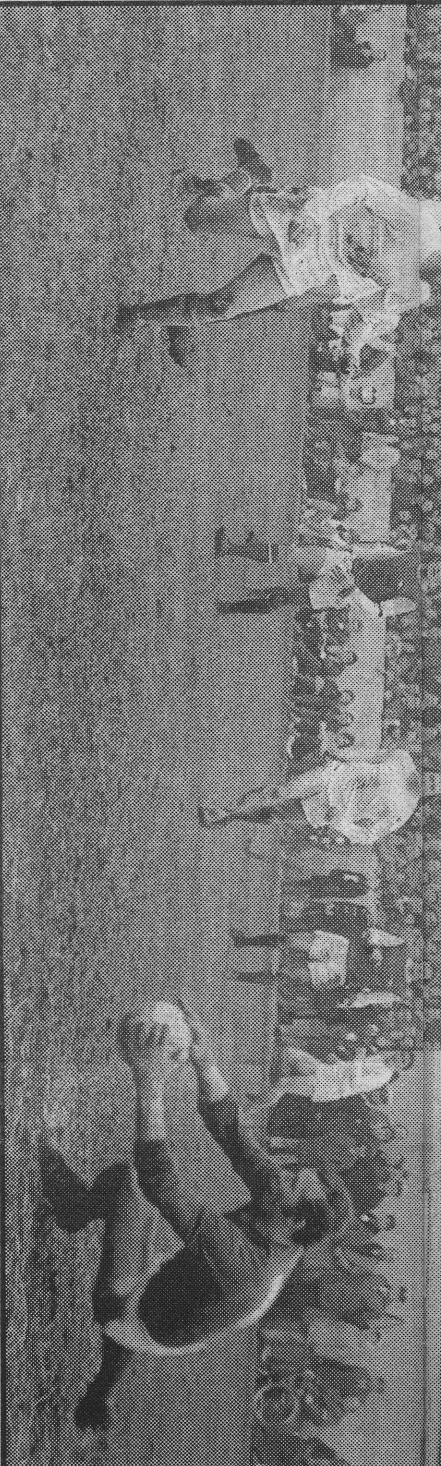


**Professional.**
