

ENFIELD SKIPPER HEADS FOR YEOVIL

GRAHAM Roberts' disappointment at failing to make it six points out of six when Yeovil Town met Dagenham & Redbridge on Tuesday was softened by the news that he is about to complete the signing of the midfielder he has been trailing for weeks – the Enfield skipper Paul Turner.

Turner, who made 37 Football League appearances for Cambridge United before a five-year stint with Enfield,

was a driving force in the Enfield team that finished above Yeovil in the ICIS League last season.

They have fought to keep him, but he went to the Football Association last week to claim that a contract technicality had left him a free agent.

Said Roberts: "He received a letter from the FA this week telling him that his claim was upheld, that he was a free agent, and that Enfield had no right of appeal. He has been

keen to come here, so all that remains is for me to tie up the loose ends.

"Nothing is certain until his name is on the form, but I shall meet him on Thursday and expect to wrap it up".

Turner, 27, is due to train with Yeovil tonight and is likely to be in the squad that entertains Bromley on Saturday.

Roberts has also signed Chris Moors, the local striker who has been freed by Premiership West Ham where he had one year as a full professional following a YTS.

Moors earned a contract with some promising substitute displays in the pre-season friendlies. He also put himself about effectively when he came on as a late substitute in the 3-2 win at Grays Athletic on Saturday.
