

Yeovil crash out of cup

YEOVIL Town bowed out of the FA Umbro Trophy on Monday, beaten 2-1 at Huish Park by Vauxhall Conference side Hayes in a first round second replay.

The Glovers could have been 4-0 ahead by the time Hayes struck the opening goal, Martin Randall heading in from the Londoners' first attack after ten minutes.

Town spurned more good chances before they deservedly levelled in the 37th minute, Lee Harvey netting from the spot after a foul on Graham Kemp by Jason Goodcliffe.

Hayes had the better of the second half and hit the winner in the 65th minute, a fine header from Randall bringing him his sixth goal in four games.

Yeovil pressed in the closing stages, but the closest they came to another goal was when Jerry Gill had an effort cleared off the line.
